# Dear changemakers in AI policy,

Thank you for your interest in AI Governance. This field of activity is under construction, and it mirrors our other great social challenges, like the oppression and pollution resulting from our economic systems. AI multiplies automation possibilities and scale efficiencies across most sectors, both in constructive and destructive ways. As a set of technologies, it leaves no community untouched.

As you may know, The Aula Fellowship is a collective of specialists on AI from several sectors. Our mission is to ensure that everyone can access the conversation on AI. We connect our collective understandings to the communities we inhabit. In the field, this means we have participated in hundreds of conversations on AI in society.

In December 2025, we published v0.1 of [The Aula Convening Guidelines](https://theaulafellowship.org/2025/12/13/aula-convening-guideline-2025-ed), to provide communities and decision makers with the means to design productive conversations. Such convenings increase community capacity to decide, provide decision makers with legitimacy to govern, and guide industry on product/service design.

We have been invited to consider partnering with AI House for their 2027 edition. To that end, we went this year. We sought out and were able to accept several invitations to join conversations in Davos in January 2026. This was during, but not at, the World Economic Forum (WEF), at WEF-adjacent events and pavilions. As curators and conveners, our focus was on AI House Davos.

# Goals and Results :

## Aula@AI House Davos 2026

---

Our goals for attending were to answer questions.

These were a yes:

- Are there people there with power who are honest, courageous, and hopeful about our biggest problems?
- Are our convening guidelines needed?
- Can we identify allies for actions?
- Are we skilled enough / big enough to work as a team on the world stage?
- Can we see how and why to work on Aula @ Davos 2027?

These are more complex:

- Can we see who is missing from the conversations?
- Are we welcome?

These are still unknown:

- Will we be able to build coalitions around the convening guidelines?
- Will this help us to secure stable independent financing for our operations?
- Will partnering with AI House 2027 serve our mission?



**We have observed** and considered the power flows at Davos and other global tech governance events, on the topic of AI.

We are preparing 5 global convenings.

# The Power Analysis

---

## Executive Summary of the Power Analysis Annex

At AI House Davos 2026, we sought out people who displayed **honesty** about complex contemporary challenges, **courage** in how they view their own power to act, and **hope** that things can work out for the best. These qualities indicate willingness and capacity to take action.

We have analyzed AI House as a **field-configuring event** where people exchange ideas and shape future actions. Formal/institutionalised and informal/social forms of power influence what directions become possible. We then distinguish between formal power vested in regulators, executives, sponsors, and organizers, and informal power exercised by curated audiences, media, academics, and local actors.

We identify **underrepresented perspectives**: small organizations, civil society advocates, cultural sectors, protestors, women, people of the Global Majority, and people involved in using AI in military and security settings. These indicate where AI governance is missing civil society perspectives and where additional voices can step in.

Decision makers and technologists know that **fit to purpose decisions require everyone to join in the conversation**. Observing where power concentrates reveals where access to the conversation on AI can expand. The structural question is: **how do we ensure that everyone can access the conversation on AI?**

We present our limitations. Lastly, the post-Script: **Who are the Tech Diplomats?** examines the professional class shaping AI governance, asking what power they have, how they use it, what constraints they face, and how we can help them build legitimacy for collective decision-making.

# The Aula Convening Guidelines

---

These guidelines cover how decision makers, including community leaders, policymakers and developers, can design community events for decision-making legitimacy. They work across meeting methods and cultures.

1. Plan for engagement, not opinions.
2. Consider the different types of power, and how these are honoured in this community.
3. Provide material comforts such as time, space, food.
4. Ensure accessibility.
5. Directly address historic and actual power imbalances.
6. Follow up: don't disappear.

Convenings on AI can vary greatly. Topics change, so do ways and means. The 5 convenings proposed here are specific to the relations and sectors in which the organizing team of Aula Fellows have specialties. We put the guidelines into practice and thought through each item, as well as our own capacities. These 5 Convenings are presented here in summary, with the SDGs and contact information. We will be releasing specific briefs for each convening, over the coming weeks.

## Convening Design for These 5 Events

These convenings have features that are very different from standard policy conferences:

Town-hall style discussions (no panels).

Held in cultural alignment with direct democracy.

We invite the whole gamut of people who are involved in the sector/hard question.

Partners present their written position statement 1 month prior, open for comments.

Each partner pays according to their means.

Artists, comedians, philosophers, spiritual leaders, youth, and social scientists accompany the process.

Entirely filmed, recorded, and streamed online.

Massive online participation.

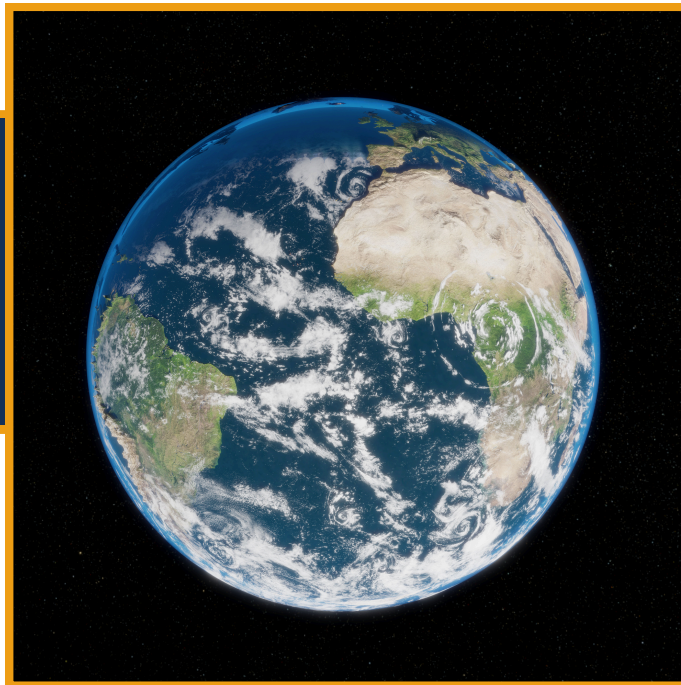
# How to Get Involved
